




will heap burning coals on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Gospeller The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Offertory Sentences

Each Sunday, we offer to God the gifts of the community. Often, this comes in the form of money, bread, and wine. Before offering our gifts to God, the priest introduces that time by saying an Offertory Sentence. In our current Book of Common Prayer, we are allowed to choose from a list of provided on page 376, or we can choose another piece of fitting Scripture. At Church of the Nativity in Huntsville, Alabama, the Offertory Sentence there is always "Do not store up for yourselves treasure on Earth but store up for yourselves treasure in Heaven. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." The use of Offertory Sentences started with the 1549 BCP, and they are meant to encourage thoughtful, intentional giving of all our gifts.

All are welcome at God's table. People who are searching for a deeper understanding and relationship with God who do not wish to partake are invited to receive a blessing. Come forward to the front of the chancel at the direction of the ushers, simply cross your arms over your chest. To receive the bread and the wine, extend your hands upward, palms crossed. When receiving the wine, please assist the chalice as it is offered. To indicate a gluten free wafer, cross your hands one on top of the other.

Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food, in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.
