Call to Order

The meeting was called to order. Sylvia Wheatly welcomed all attendees. The ECW Prayer was said by all.

Broad Street Clinic Guest Speaker

Diane Meelheim introduced Lou Johnson, Broad Street Clinic's new Executive Director, our Guest Speaker for this meeting. The highlights of Lou's speech follow:

The Broad Street Clinic was founded in 1993 by county physicians and other concerned citizens as a private non-profit, free health clinic serving the adult residents of Carteret County and surrounding areas. They celebrated their 30th anniversary in 2023 and treated three thousand patients in 2023. Its mission is to provide access to medical care for the uninsured and low-income population in our community.

The Clinic is open Monday through Thursday. Monday and Tuesday mornings are patient days when volunteer Doctors, Nurse Practitioners, and Nurses work up and see patients. The Specialties that are covered: Internal Medicine, Dermatology, Endocrinology, Pulmonology, Cardiology, and Podiatry (new in February). Thursday is Pharmacy Day when the volunteer Pharmacy manager and volunteer pharmacists prepare up to five hundred prescriptions for on average 150 patients.

A Dental bus run by the North Carolina Baptist Men's Association and staffed by local volunteer dentists and hygienists comes to the Clinic on an average of once a quarter. Patients are seen and treated on Friday and Saturday; up to 30 patients may be seen on Friday and 25 on Saturday. In addition to the bus, patients may be seen by a dental hygienist on Wednesdays. A new program at the clinic is a partnership with the dental program at Carteret Community College. Students have begun to use the space at the clinic.

Dr. Patterson, a local Optometrist, sees Broad Street Clinic patients at his office for a reduced rate which is covered by the clinic. Also, the Lions Club helps by providing eyeglasses.

Post meeting note: There is a Lions Club box for eyeglasses in the Parish Hall.

There are 15 paid staff members. The clinic is truly blessed for the volunteer support from St. Paul's and other charitable organizations in our community. Out of 33 weekly volunteers, St. Paul's provides 17. See Attachment #1 - St Paul's Volunteers at the Broad Street Clinic.

More volunteers are always needed! A medical background or special skills are not required. Activities such as answering the phone, greeting patients, entering data, collecting data are needed. Please call the clinic if you'd like to learn more about volunteer opportunities.
